


# The benefits of reading

# Scared to Death – Anthony Horowitz





# Best Friends – Jacqueline Wilson




Summary: Gemma and Alice were born on the same day and have been devoted friends ever since. However, disaster strikes when Alice has to move to Scotland.




# Lion – Saroo Brierley



**Why I like this book?** I like to read success stories. This is a story of someone overcoming various challenges.



